Dancewave presents its **Summer Dance Intensive** for kids and teens ages 10-18 years old, to take place at the Old First Reformed Church, 729 Carroll Street (on corner of 7th Avenue) in Park Slope, Brooklyn, **August 16-27, 2010**. The **Summer Dance Intensive** provides 2 weeks of day-long instruction in different dance disciplines taught by renowned professional teachers. Class offerings this year include Ballet, Modern, Street Jazz, Salsa, Tap, African, Theater Jazz, Choreolab, Hip Hop and Bollywood.

This week will provide a unique opportunity to train on a more rigorous level in ballet and learn original ballet repertory by Giada Ferrone. Students will have the opportunity to present their work to the public at our **Fridays at Five Student Showing**.
